Hot Rodders of Tomorrow Scholarship

Hot Rodders of Tomorrow is a non-profit and S.T.E.M (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) educational program with an established engine build competition and mission to develop youth for the automotive aftermarket racing and performance industry. Secondary High Schools assemble teams that compete in national qualifying events with competition guidelines and judging established and provided by Hot Rodders of Tomorrow. The top 39 teams from qualifying events meet in head to head competition at the SEMA and Performance Racing Industry tradeshows. Scholarships:

Each team member placing 1st – 39th place in the final competitions as determined by Hot Rodders of Tomorrow will earn scholarships, amounts vary dependent on place finished.

Scholarship amounts for each winning team: 1st place – 10,000; 2nd place – 9,500, 3rd place – 9,000, 4th place – 8,500, 5th place – 8,000, 6th place – 7,500, 7th place – 7,000, 8th place – 6,500, 9th place – 6,000, 10th place – 5,500; 11th thru 39th place – 5,000

Hot Rodders of Tomorrow Scholarship Requirements

Recipients may begin training immediately after high school graduation as soon as their chosen program is available. Recipients must commit to use scholarship within sixty (60) days of high school graduation and start classroom attendance at WyoTech within one (1) year of high school graduation. Scholarship recipients must maintain satisfactory academic progress and meet all attendance and graduation requirements without interruption of attendance with the exception in the case of an approved Leave of Absence.

Hot Rodders of Tomorrow scholarship available for programs at the Laramie and Daytona campus locations only.

- **ADDENDUM:** The language that is underlined below has been reinstated into the Dispute Resolution Policy.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION POLICY

1. You may choose to initiate the terms of the following dispute resolution policy in lieu of or prior to initiating a legal claim in a court of competent jurisdiction against the School. As set forth below, if you are not satisfied with the outcome of the internal dispute resolution process, you may, but are not required to, seek resolution of your complaint through arbitration or before a court of competent jurisdiction. In the event that you file for arbitration or if you file a claim before a court of competent jurisdiction, you agree not to combine or consolidate any claims with those of other students, such as in a class or mass action. IN THE EVENT THAT YOU ELECT TO BRING A CLAIM IN COURT, YOU AGREE TO WAIVE YOUR RIGHTS TO A JURY TRIAL AND THAT THE CLAIM SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO A JUDGE ONLY AND NOT TO A JURY.
